The gender breakdown is 59 percent female and 41 percent male.
- **Broad Appeal** – The Christopher Columbus Awards program attracts students in all areas of the country, and urban and rural participation in the program has steadily increased each year. In the current competition year, urban and rural schools comprise 36 percent of participating schools.

 - Gives students the opportunity to learn how to present ideas to adults on a one-on-one basis, and realize that their ideas have merit.
